Improving GMO regulations for laboratory and biomedical research

Introduction

Rural Women New Zealand (RWNZ) welcomes the opportunity to provide feedback to the Ministry for the Environment on proposed changes to Aotearoa New Zealand's legislation and regulations for genetically modified organisms (GMOs) used in laboratory settings and for biomedical therapies.

Comments

1. RWNZ is open to the proposed response to concerns from the research community that current GMO regulations are hindering research and innovation, with the aim of this consultation to remove barriers to foster research and improve health outcomes.
2. Our view is based on the anticipated benefits to rural communities and the potential for increased involvement of women in science and agriculture within the research.
3. We note the proposals apply only to laboratory settings, however there is no definition provided as to what a laboratory setting is and/or where these might be created and located. We ask that a description or further detail be provided to clarify what a laboratory would entail and the parameters of how and where such facilities might be situated.
