



Selection Criteria

- Preference will be given to a woman who will be living and working within rural communities or provincial towns located within the region defined.
- The applicant will need to provide a profile outlining their past achievements, proposed study programme, educational goals and their long term objectives.
- The applicant will be required to list two referees.
- The applicant may be required to attend an interview.

Conditions of acceptance of the award

The grant will be paid on production of evidence of acceptance at a NZQA approved facility.

Evidence is required within one month that course fees have been paid. If this is not provided, the grant shall be returned.

The decision of the RWNZ Regional Committee is final and no correspondence regarding its decision will be entered into. You will be notified of the results of your application.

Award payment

- Payment of the Norma Evans Second Chance Education Award will be made to the successful applicant by 30 November, and on proof of enrolment in the indicated field of study.
- Rural Women New Zealand's national office must be advised immediately if the successful applicant withdraws from the course before completing the academic year, as a proportional refund will be expected.

About Norma Evans

Norma Mae Jackson was born 27th May 1924 and married Bob Evans, farm hand in 1946. They worked in Omarama and Kurow until 1955 when they won a soldier settlement farm ballot enabling them to purchase a farm at Rotomahana in the Rotorua district.

This necessitated travelling north with their four beautiful daughters. Farming posed huge challenges in those days prior to selenium and cobalt being discovered as essential elements for animals to survive and thrive

Norma admits to being a very shy lady when she first settled in the Rerewhakaaitu area but hall and school committees, youth club, Women's Division of the Farmers Union followed by Rural Woman New Zealand (RWNZ) combined to challenge her to step up and out beyond the farm gate.

Norma led from the front, travelling throughout New Zealand and overseas working for rural people. Her projects number many and her six books about rural life showcase her success. A New Zealand Order of Merit was awarded for her services to community.

Norma the poet is reflected in this extract from her 'Ode to Life', these words tell the story of the Norma we know and love:

*'A depression, a war, hardships I have seen.
Make do and Mend. Hand craft to be seen.
Born a Collector. I really must have been.
Curator of treasurers, just waiting to be seen.'

To encourage women wishing to advance in the workforce, to obtain qualifications improving their career opportunities and independence.

The RWNZ Region Five (Rimaniui) Second Chance Education Award has been created by fellow RWNZ members in her region. It is to honour an outstanding woman, who has spent her life working really hard to create healthy, sustainable rural communities, supportive of the people who live there.

Norma firmly believes that life is an apprenticeship that is on-going, and that one must fight to meet its challenges and to always grasp learning opportunities.

Overview of the Award

- One award will be offered to a woman who wishes to complete a tertiary study programme to assist her to return to or enter the work force thereby enabling her to better develop her career.
- Up to \$2000 for one year of tertiary study, with consideration of a second year's grant of up to \$2000 depending on the tertiary study undertaken and the grades achieved.
